Bankruptcy Act 1966, section 80 of Bankruptcy Regulations 2021

Use this form to request for your address or other information to be hidden on the NPII.

The Official Receiver will consider withholding your address and/or occupation from the NPII if publishing it is likely to put your safety at risk (e.g. because of family violence, creditor threats, or mental health reasons). Evidence is not mandatory, however if available, it can be used to support your request.

**Note: You cannot request your name or date of birth to be hidden on the NPII.**

This form can also be used to correct inaccurate or misleading information on the NPII.
